SCHMIDT OCEAN INSTITUTE | Artist-at-Sea



Selected for the Schmidt Ocean Institute's Artist-at-Sea residency, Brodie will embark on an extraordinary expedition to Antartica in January 2025. Aboard the R/V Falkor (too), he will join leading international scientists to explore critical issues such as ice-sheet melt, biodiversity, and climate change.

This unique programme brings art and science together, offering a rare opportunity to observe cutting-edge research in action. The residency will inspire a new body of work that responds directly to the science observed while at sea, translating complex environmental data into compelling creative expression.

SHOREDITCH WORKS | Public Realm Commission



his year, the studio was commissioned to create a sculptural furniture scheme for the public realm at Shoreditch Works, a transformative mixed-use redevelopment in London by Linea Properties.

Positioned at the heart of Hackney's creative enterprise zone and London's Fashion District, the project sets a new standard for sustainable urban living. The 1.48-hectare site, designed in a collaboration with KPF Architects and Richard Griffiths Architects seamlessly blends commercial, residential, and creative spaces.

For the public realm, the studio designed multi-tiered seating connecting the restaurant terrace to the central piazza, integrated seating-planters supporting a greening programme, and pebble-shaped benches that evoke the motion of skimming stones. Together, these elements create a continuous dialogue between space, narrative, and functionality.




This month, T: The New York Times Style Magazine Australia featured Brodie's work in The Greats issue, spotlighting leaders driving meaningful change.
